You are 22, a fashion model of African origin.	You are 10 years old and live in a farmhouse in the country with cows, geese and chickens. You have three brothers and one sister.
You are 10 and have a learning disability that makes you two classes behind in school. You are taller than all the other kids in your class.	You are 72, male, a retired worker from a factory that makes shoes.
You are a 24 years old female refugee from Rwanda.	You are 19 years, a soldier in the army, doing compulsory military service.
You are an only child, nine years old. You live alone with your mother in an apartment in the city. Your mother works in a factory. You are very good at music and dancing.	You are the president of a party-political youth organisation (whose "mother" party is now in power).
You are 44, an unemployed schoolteacher in a country whose new official language you are not fluent in.	You are 48, female, and work as a store cashier at a supermarket chain.
